P.I.C.—Police Information Checklist

What to report about a suspicious person:



BASIC

Race / Male or female

CLOTHES

Jacket / Long coat Dress coat / Suit Hat / Baseball cap Jeans / Khaki pants Dress pants / Shorts T-shirt (color) / Dress shirt

SHOES

Tennis shoes / High heels Brown leather / Black leather

FACE


Eyes (brown, blue, green)
Glasses / Beard (full, on chin)
Bald or Curly hair / Wig
Long or short hair / Afro
Gold in mouth
Missing teeth
Scars / Headband


OTHER

Limp or handicap / Cane Jewelry (bracelet, rings, earring) Handbag Carrying anything Car / Truck / Bike Dog / Cat

How to Report Crime and Suspicious Activities

- 1. Call 862-8600 if it is <u>not</u> an emergency. Call 911 for emergencies.
- 2. Give the dispatcher a detailed description:
 - a) What happened? Where?
 - b) How many people were involved? What did they look like? What race? Male or female? Tall or short? What clothing?
 - c) What cars were involved? License plate numbers? Color? Make/Model?
- Keep a list of things that you have seen and reported. Write down:
 - a) Date / Time / Place of Problem
 - b) What happened
 - c) The dispatcher's name and the time you called.





6. **Don't give up! Keep reporting illegal activities.** It takes time for the police to investigate and build a good case. But keep calling! The more information we can give, the better. The more calls the police get, the more pressure to get something done!
