Introduction

The purpose of this document is to provide an overview of the Lakewood Police Department. The Lakewood Police Department currently consist of 5 sworn officers, 7 reserve officers. In 2009 the Lakewood Police Department:

- Answered 1611 calls for service
- Completed 230 incident reports
- Made 290 arrest (278 misdemeanor / 12 felony)
- Issued 2758 citations
- Produced 2784 traffic stops
- Investigated 58 motor vehicle crashes
- Attended over 500 hours of training
- Recieved a DUI enforcement grant from GHSO

In the upcoming year the Lakewood Police Department will place an effort in reducing the crime in the community. The officers will continue their job skill training in order to provide a stronger and dedicated police force.

The department in the future, will apply for other grants that may be available. These grants may assist in the better protection and equipment for the department.



Lakewood Police Department





"THE NEW PATROL LOOK"

In the year of 2009 the Lakewood Police Department changed the look of the patrol vehicles. The department upgraded the light bars to the LED version that is much more visible to the motorist. The LED light bars utilize a smaller amount of amperage to illuminate which in turn reduces the vehicle maintenance required. The light bars were purchased at a lower cost than any other bar utilizing the same specifications.

The vehicle decal was also changed in an effort to personalize the police departments patrol vehicles from other agencies. The new decals are a lesser cost than the previous ones, which allows the department to utilize the cost savings in other areas.

Fleet

Currently in our fleet we have 7 vehicles, of those:

- 6 vehicles are used by Patrol Officers and Supervisors
 - a) 4 of the 7 are assigned to full time officers
 - b) 1 of the 7 is assigned to the reserve officers
- 1 vehicle is assigned to Patrol Administration
- 1 vehicle is used in an undercover capacity

Of the 6 patrol vehicles the following is the mileage of the units:

The mileage displayed above does show that there are two vehicles that will have to be replaced in the near future. This would reduce the cost of continued maintenance on these units along with the increased measures of officer safety.

The department also utilizes a vehicle that was seized on narcotics violations for the purpose of undercover operations.

Grants

The department was a recipient of a Governor's Highway Safety Program for the 2008/2009 budget year. The grant totaled \$11,661.84 in funds available.

- DUI Enforcement Grant allowing officers to work overtime hours for the detection of intoxicated drivers.
- The purchase of a (1) new handheld radar unit for speed detection.
- The purchase of traffic safety vest for all officers.
- The purchase of traffic safety cones for traffic direction.
- The purchase of flashlights for all officers

The grant goal was to achieve 40 Driving Under Influence arrest for the grant period (10-1-08 thru 09-30-09)

There were a total of 46 DUI arrest made within the period, which exceeds the goal set forth.

There were a total of 158.75 hours of overtime worked by the officers during the grant period.

The Lakewood Police applied for the grant once again for 2009/2010 periods. Unfortunately the grant was denied due to the Federal deficit in the funding to the Governor's Highway Safety Office.

The grant was in an effort to provide DUI detection and purchase mobile video cameras for all patrol units. The cameras would have assisted the officers in the prosecution of DUI offenders.

Training

During the 2009 year the officers have continued their training by attending specialized schools. The schools attended are such as leadership/management, computerized traffic crash reporting (TRACS), computer/cell phone investigation, laser radar instructor, baton instructor and police staff and command. The schools attended were at little or no cost to the department.

The Chief of Police applied for a state grant for tuition to the Northwestern University School of Police Staff and Command, which was held in Nashville, TN. The chief was awarded a tuition scholarship grant from the Tennessee Association Chief of Police. After completion of the school the chief earned a total of 21 college semester hours and a GPA of 3.7 of possible 4.0.

The Reserves Program

This program continues to be highly effective in assisting the full-time officers on patrol and special assignments. In 2009, the reserve unit had 280 hours of training in various fields pertaining to the job. They also worked a total of 1664 hours on patrol for a benefit of \$28,324.08 to the Lakewood Police Department.

In the upcoming year of 2010 the reserve officers will assist in various programs for the juveniles and the Lakewood community.

Awards

In an effort to recognize the efforts of the employees of the department, several awards were given out during the 2009 year. At the end of the year, the employees of the department voted on the 2009 officer of the year. This award will be given out during the February commission meeting.

Computers

The City of Lakewood has upgraded its office computers by receiving (10) 19" flat panel computer monitors and (3) Dell Laptop computers through the Department of Defense (DRMO) Reutilization Program. The program allows government agencies to request specific items from the military at no cost and must be used by the agencies. The Lakewood Police Department will continue to monitor the program in an effort to receive additional items in the future.
